

John Argyris Award for the best paper by a young researcher in the field of Computational Mechanics

This Award was initiated to honor Professor John Argyris whose research work for more than 50 years had a pioneering impact on computational mechanics both in theory and in practice. The award recognized his significant contribution both to the field and to the international journal *Computer Methods in Applied Mechanics and Engineering*, of which he was a founding editor.

Elsevier, publisher of the Journal, sponsored the award, which was supported by IACM in terms of providing scientific assistance in the selection procedure. Furthermore, the award was given every two years coinciding with the IACM World Congresses on Computational Mechanics.

This award to the best paper was discontinued in 2012. In 2013 IACM decided to rename the already existing IACM Award for Young Scientist to the current "The IACM John Argyris Award for Young Scientists". The new name was applied to all previous IACM awardees in this category.
